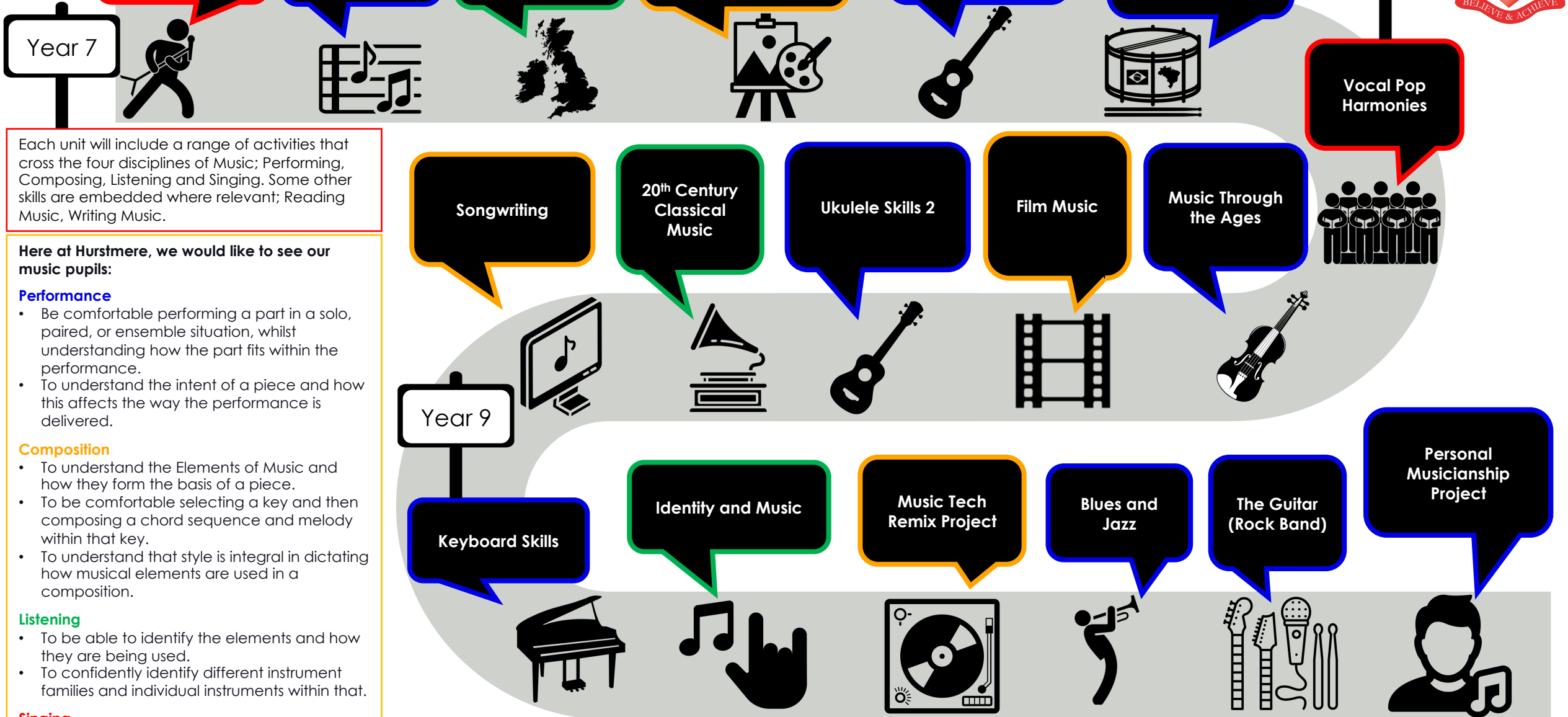


Our Musical Learning Journey in KS3

Each unit will include a range of activities that cross the four disciplines of Music; Performing, Composing, Listening and Singing. Some other skills are embedded where relevant; Reading Music, Writing Music.

Here at Hurstmere, we would like to see our music pupils:

Performance

- Be comfortable performing a part in a solo, paired, or ensemble situation, whilst understanding how the part fits within the performance.
- To understand the intent of a piece and how this affects the way the performance is delivered.

Composition

- To understand the Elements of Music and how they form the basis of a piece.
- To be comfortable selecting a key and then composing a chord sequence and melody within that key.
- To understand that style is integral in dictating how musical elements are used in a composition.

Listening

- To be able to identify the elements and how they are being used.
- To confidently identify different instrument families and individual instruments within that.

Singing

- Be able to sing confidently with expression.
